### WHY SLIPS / TRIPS / FALLS ARE SO IMPORTANT

• So far in 2023, 16% of claims received by Rockwood Casualty have been slip/trip/fall incidents. As the winter season approaches and slippery, outdoor surfaces are more prevalent, this number could increase!



According to the National Safety Council, in 2021, <u>680 workers died, and in 2020 49,250 were injured</u> due to falls from elevation. All of these deaths are preventable.

# OSHA's Final Rule on Recordkeeping

Starting January 1, 2024, OSHA's Revised Rule on Annual Injury and Illness Data submission will be implemented. See the final rule <a href="here">here</a>.

OSHA Fact Sheet on Improving Tracking of Workplace Injuries and Illnesses Frequently Asked Questions

#### The New Requirements

- Certain establishments must electronically submit to OSHA detailed information about each recordable injury and illness entered on their previous calendar year's OSHA 300 Log and 301 Incident Report forms (29 CFR 1904.41). This includes the date, physical location, and severity of the injury or illness; details about the worker who was injured; and details about how the injury or illness occurred.
- Only establishments with 100 or more employees in designated industries are required to submit case-specific information from the OSHA Form 300 Log and the OSHA Form 301 Incident Report.
  - Establishments that had a peak employment of 100 or more employees during the previous calendar year meet this size criteria.
  - The designated industries are listed in <u>Appendix B to Subpart E of 29 C.F.R. Part</u> 1904.
  - One way to determine if your establishment(s) is required to report these data is by using our <u>ITA Coverage Application</u>.
  - The requirements apply to establishments covered by Federal OSHA, as well as establishments covered by states with their own occupational safety and health programs (i.e., State Plans).
- The data must be electronically submitted through OSHA's <a href="Injury Tracking Application (ITA)">Injury Tracking Application (ITA)</a>. There are 3 ways to submit the data: (1) webform on the ITA, (2) submission of a csv file to the ITA, or (3) use of an application programming interface (API) feed. The ITA will begin accepting 2023 injury and illness data on January 2, 2024. The due date to complete this submission is March 2, 2024. The submission requirement is annual, and the deadline for timely submission of the previous year's injury and illness data will be on March 2 of each year.
