


Toolbox Safety Talks

Bloodborne Pathogens

- 1) What are the hazards involved with bloodborne pathogens?
 - a. Infectious diseases
- **2)** What hazards should be recognized?
 - a. Blood
 - b. Bodily fluids
 - c. Sewage
- **3)** What safe practices should be used?
 - a. Treat all blood and body fluids as if they were hazardous
 - b. Use PPE (latex gloves, gowns, masks, etc.)
 - c. Bandage cuts, scrapes, and broken skin
 - d. Discard sharp objects in proper containers
 - e. Wash your hands every time you exit the bathroom
 - f. Wash hands and any other areas that contact blood or other body fluids
 - g. Limit access and disinfect equipment, tools, and flooring that has come in contact with blood or other body fluids
 - h. Never recap or share needles
- **4)** Why do we never recap needles?
- **5)** What are our procedures when someone is bleeding?
- **6)** Do we have containers for disposing sharp objects?
- **7)** Where is our first aid kit?
- **8)** Why should we never eat, smoke, or dip snuff in a bathroom?
